DOG ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, the dog displays no sign of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Deaf and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Females in season may not participate, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from an injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance may not participate. No dog shall compete if it is sutured, bandaged, or has any visible wounds.

No entries will be accepted by phone, email, or fax. NO HAND DELIVERIES Express mail entries must include the signature waiver allowing them to be left at the secretary's address. Inquiries may be directed the Trial Secretary at scentwork.aw@gmail.com. No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry and the Trial Secretary will add a \$25.00 collection fee to the amount of each invalid check.

Refunds. No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee.

Bitches in season will be refunded the full entry fee. Notification in writing must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial. **Dogs pulled after closing because of injury, suspected of having a contagious illness, or other medical condition are eligible for a 75% refund.** Owner should provide a note from their veterinarian. The health and safety of your dog and all other dogs entered at the trial should be seriously respected.

In the event that the handler is positive or suspected to have contracted COVID-19 or is exhibiting symptoms consistent with COVID, the club reserves the right to refund that handler's entry if they are unable to work their dog. The exhibitor must notify the trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the first class of the day.

SEARCH AREA & RING CONDITIONS

Search areas may be of any shape, and of the size specified in the Regulations for each class. Searches may be indoors, on matted, carpeted, or tiled surfaces, or outdoors on grass, gravel, earth, concrete, or asphalt surfaces. Trial will take place rain or shine.

Search area sizes will be as stated in the AKC regulations for all elements and levels.

STAGING AREA, HANDLER'S BREIFING, AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Staging Area will be out of view of search area(s). Staging area will include warm-up and waiting areas.

The **Handler's Briefing** will take place in view of the search area prior to the start of each class, after the hide(s) have been set and after the Demo Dog has run. In the Handler's Briefing the judge will explain if there's an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search. NO DOGS are to be present during the Handler's Briefing. We will be doing a video recorded walkthrough that will be available to teams the night prior to the searches, teams will ALSO be receiving a briefing on the line by their judge.

One labeled container per target odor being used in the trial on that day will be placed in the warm-up area. This will allow handler-dog teams to prepare themselves for the search prior to their run. Each team should limit their warm-up to two minutes or less so that others may be able to use the warm-up area as well. Clubs may also place blank containers in the warm up area if they choose.

SITE INFORMATION

Trial Site. It is not appropriate to scout the trial location prior to the trial date, this includes driving into the parking lot or otherwise disturbing their regular business. Many search locations are real-life environments, and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future. This trial site will not be used for Scent training one week before the trial.

Possession of Odors and Training. Chapter 5. Section 35 of the Scent Work Regulations state "No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area".

Spectator Area. Spectators are welcome! There may be some searches that are too small to allow spectators (ex. Interior) and it is up to the judge's discretion. Spectators are expected to remain in designated areas, including for detective. Spectators are forbidden to discuss <u>any</u> details of the searches with handlers who have not run (and please refrain from discussing the searches until all dogs have run)!

Crating space You will be staging from your car. FCRSA will not be responsible for any lost or damaged items left at the show site. There will be no overnight security.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds. Please only potty on the trial property and within the designated areas.

High in Trial

All level High in Trial rosettes will be offered at this trial. Only teams who participate in the same difficulty level in *all* elements offered (Container, Interior, and Buried), and qualify in each are eligible to win High in Trial. There is no separate High In Trial for the Novice A and Novice B sections; they are combined. The High in Trial is determined by adding the team's faults across the elements. If there is a tie based on faults, then the team's times across the elements will be summed and the faster finishing team will win. Teams winning High In Trial will earn a rosette.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

A preliminary confirmation will be sent once your entry is received. A final confirmation with trial details will be sent out about a week before the trial.

Handler Briefings – you will receive links to videos of your search areas the night before the trial. The judge will also give each exhibitor a short briefing when you come to each search area. There will be no general briefing at the start of the day. PLEASE BE SURE TO READ THROUGH YOUR final exhibitor briefing letter that will be emailed one week prior to the trial. This will include all your information for parking, times to arrive, and any other important information!

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR AND LIABILITY

The **safety of the dog** is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. **It is expressly understood** that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The **Flat-Coated Retriever Society of America (FCRSA)** ("the club") and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the club or any official thereof.

Collars, Leashes and Harnesses. During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge (tags ok). Dogs are permitted to have a wearable camera such as a Go Pro may be mounted to the dog's harness, if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material.

All dogs must be on leash at all times, and retractable leashes may not be used when on trial grounds (except during judged searches where allowed). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed. Handlers will have the option to run Detective class off-leash.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required. Details about flow and run order progression will be covered in the briefing.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

Claims will be arbitrated as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event.



Position Descriptions:

Judge's Steward - Responsible for helping the judge throughout the trial. Usually this position is filled by someone who is not running in the trial. Duties can include - handling "hot" items/ "cold" items, welcoming next competitor to search area, ensuring judge is comfortable and has water. Should be able to lift 35 lbs and stay on their feet for large portions of the day.

Timer – Responsible for starting and stopping a handheld timer. Needs to be able to hear the competitor's calls and recite the time to the judge at the conclusion of the search. Can be sitting for most searches.

Box Steward – Needed for Buried & Container searches. Will be bending, lifting up to 35 lbs, and rearranging/cleaning containers as needed.

Gate Steward, Staging Area Steward – Helps efficiently (and happily) move competitors through staging areas and into the search areas. These roles are important to running a smooth trial and for competitors to have a pleasant experience. Organization, clear communication, kindness.

Scribe Sheet Runner – Constantly moving throughout the trial, moving scribe sheets from the judge to the score room.

Judge's Steward and timer are positions preferably given to teams that are not competing or only minimally competing.
